At Becket Primary School we aim to:

Gym Club coach and weekly gym session for children in key stage one	1500	Sessions run throughout the year with consistency of attendees. There is general enthusiasm for and confidence In sessions. The gym club helps the young children with their co-ordination and gross motor skills. 40 children regularly accessed this club throughout progressing through the gymnastics proficiency awards.				
Weekly Street Dance Club led by qualified dance coach from DEDA for children in Upper Keystage 2, lower key stage 2 and Key stage 1. D3 project for KS2. The 24 of the year 6 children learned roadcraft and rode confidently on the roads around school. Track sessions – 15 of the year 6 children all progressed up to the blue line and beyond on the Derby Arena cycle track. Two pupils attended Cycle Derby club track sessions as a consequence of this opportunity
